## Brevard Zoo receives support from Lockheed Martin to help local environment

MELBOURNE, Fla., June 21, 2021 — Brevard Zoo's Restore Our Shores (ROS) program is expanding its work with mangroves thanks to a significant contribution from Lockheed Martin.

The gift, which will be used to help ROS expand hurricane mitigation projects in the Indian River Lagoon, is a new community partnership for Lockheed Martin, which has close to 2,000 employees living and working in the Space Coast region. Lockheed Martin employees will also volunteer with ROS on lagoon projects that support shoreline restoration and promote the protection of the community from the impacts of natural disasters such as strong winds, hurricanes and floods.

In addition to providing habitat for more than 90% of commercial fishery species in the area, improving water quality and storing carbon dioxide, mangroves provide resilience during natural disasters like hurricanes by stabilizing shorelines from erosion and serving a buffer zone from heavy waves.

Restore Our Shores will use the contribution from Lockheed Martin to continue its mission in Brevard County working on community shorelines, lagoons and rivers to help our community better withstand damaging winds, floods and hurricanes for years to come.
